The Court of Appeal of Yukon maintains the court record from its registry located in Whitehorse, Yukon. As such, all documents relating to Yukon appeals must be filed in the Whitehorse registry. Where the Registrar allows a motion to be heard in Vancouver or Victoria, they may direct material to be filed in registries of the Court of Appeal for British Columbia.

Appeals are to be heard in Yukon, unless otherwise directed. Parties requesting a Vancouver hearing should write the Registrar and outline factors that outweigh the interest of the local community in hearing the appeal in Whitehorse as well as any other access to justice considerations. If other parties disagree, they should provide a brief letter outlining their contrary position.

Lawyers are reminded that they must be called to the Bar in the Yukon or have a certificate of permission to act from the Law Society of Yukon to appear in Yukon Court of Appeal matters.
