Signature of Counsel

The signature of counsel on any original document should be in writing. If counsel is unable to sign a document, it is not appropriate to put quotes around the writing which is presented as their signature, i.e. "John Smith". Nor should anyone other than the author of the document sign the author's name. However, another counsel may sign on behalf

of the other by signing their own signature on the signature line, providing the author's name is indicated below the signature line. They should also legibly print their name and insert the word "for" before the author's name. See example below:

Jane Doe

Jane Doe for John Smith Counsel for the Plaintiff.
