MEMORANDUM OF JUDGMENT DELIVERED FROM THE BENCH

[1] VEALE J. (Oral): I am going to make the following provisional order.

[2] Mr. Geddes was ordered to pay \$852 per month, commencing November 1, 1999, based on a guideline income of \$56,507. As a result of going on a pension with the R.C.M.P., his income has been reduced. His pensionable income is \$20,585.67. I am going to impute an additional annual income of \$10,000 based on his ability to obtain employment, from time to time, in Teslin. So his income, both real and imputed, will be \$30,585.67, and that is effective on April 10, 2002.

Geddes v. Geddes Page: 2

[3] The result is that, as of April 2002, Mr. Geddes should have paid a guidelines table amount of \$450 per month, and counsel have agreed that the calculation of arrears that have accumulated since April 10, 2002 is approximately \$7,200.

[4] So I am, therefore, going to order that the arrears, which presently stand at approximately \$9,580, be reduced by \$7,200, which leaves outstanding arrears of \$2,380. I am going to order that Mr. Geddes pay the arrears in the sum of \$100 per month. So his total monthly payment will be \$550 until the arrears have been paid, and at that time it will be \$450 per month.
